WHAT TO BRING WITH YOU TO COME HERE AND DIVE?

- Your diving diploma or a copy. We will ask for it when you register and you'll take the risk of not being allowed to dive if you don't have it with you. The large majority of our dives are accessible to Levels 1 or Open Water. All internationally recognized diving systems are accepted: PADI, CMAS, SSI, NAUI, ANMP, FFESSM etc. We also offer CMAS, PADI, and FFESSM training programs.
- Your Diving Record Booklet. This will help your instructor in evaluating your experience and to suggest dives adapted to your level and totally safe.
- Your Medical Certificate. This is only mandatory if you decide to receive a diving level in French Polynesia (for level 1, a certificate of no counter indications to scuba diving may be delivered by your family doctor). This is not required for exploration dives. However, in case of problems and for your own safety, it is strongly recommended to bring one with you. If you do not have one, we will ask that you fill out a medical questionnaire.
- Insurance. We have Liability Insurance for ourselves and for our guests. It is however strongly recommended to get a personal insurance to cover you, in case of problems, for the cost of transportation back to your country of origin.
A Depressurization Chamber session in Tahiti cost about 420 Euros (over US\$ 550)! Make sure with your insurance company that you are covered for such activities as Scuba Diving.
Some insurance companies do exclude scuba diving as they consider it a high-risk sport. The FFESSM license with additional insurance is sufficient.
- Your equipment: We supply at no charge the following equipment: fins, mask, snorkel, pressure regulator with Octopus, electronic pressure and depth gauges, stabilizing jacket, lead belt with lead weights, diving tanks filled at 200b, and shorty.
Water temperature vary very little and a simple 3mm "shorty" (or full wet suit for the more sensitive to cold is enough.
 - From May through October, the temperatures vary between 25 and 27°C (77 and 80°F)
 - From October through April, the temperatures vary between 28 and 31°C (82 and 87°C)

Good News:

For those who wish to bring their own equipment with them, domestic airline AIR TAHITI, grants an extra 5kg excess baggage allowance upon presentation of your diving diploma and your passport.
